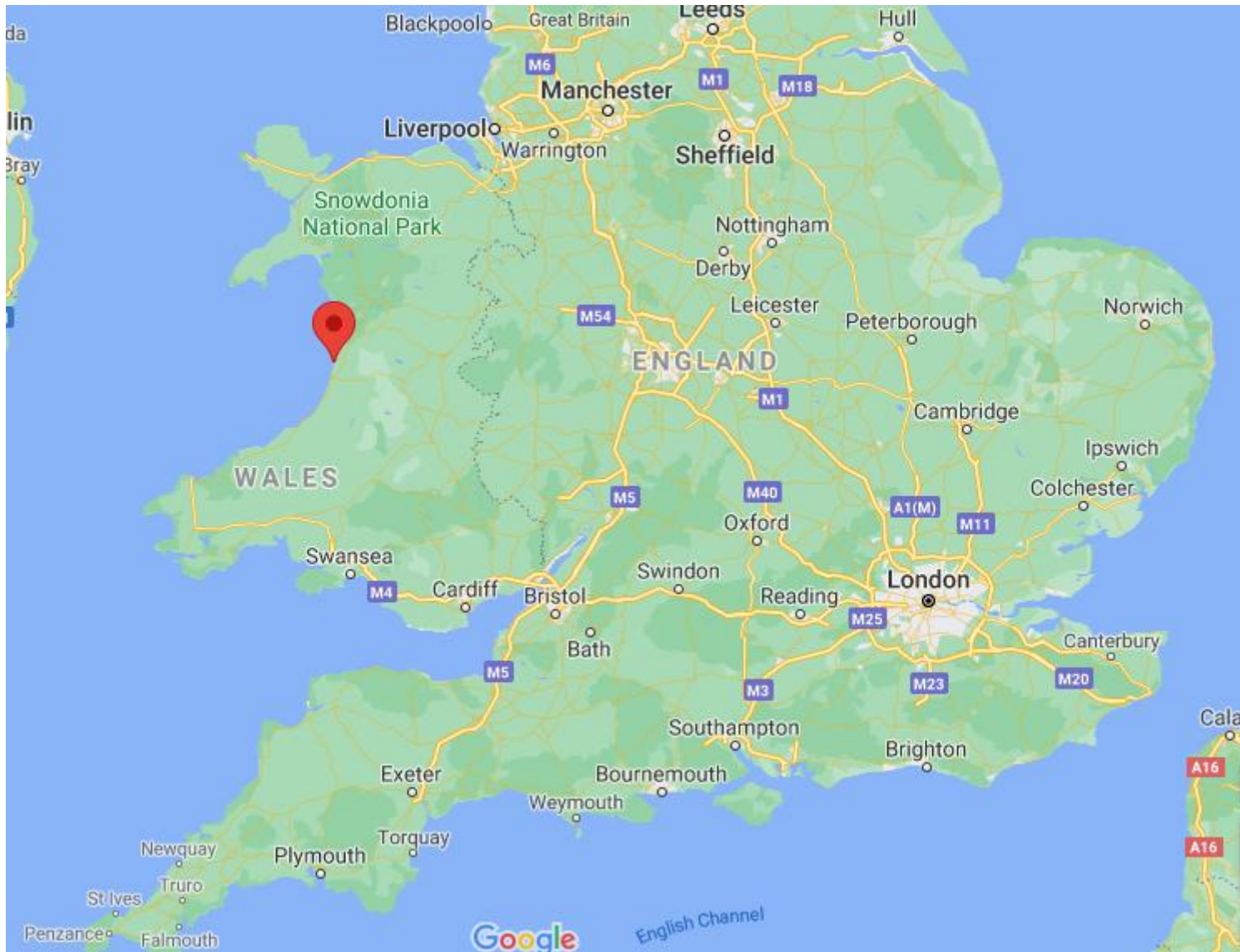

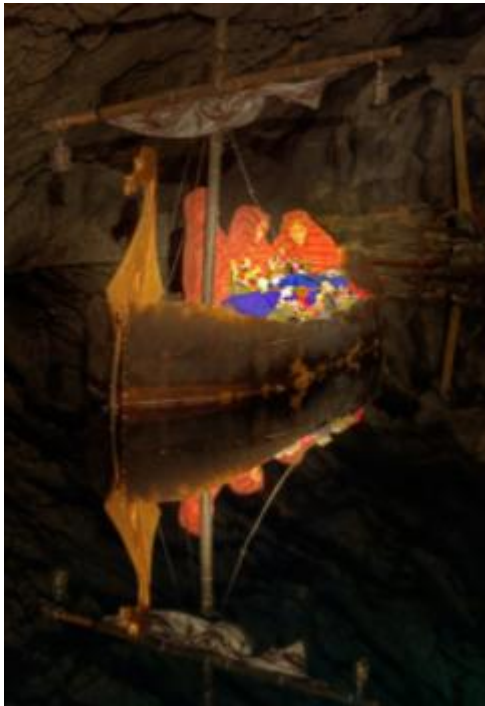
The visit offers the chance to enjoy being close to nature and explore wildlife through pond dipping and map reading.

Suggested packing



- Long sleeved jumpers / sweatshirts / lightweight waterproof jacket
- Waterproof trousers
- Trousers / jogging bottoms for day time
- Shorts (a modest length)
- T-shirts (no cropped or football shirts)
- Underwear (a few sets)
- Nightwear
- Minimum two pairs of shoes include one pair walking shoes/boots (NOT new)
- Indoor shoes / slippers
- Towel and wash kit
- Sun hat and sun cream
- Clearly labelled purse or wallet
- Camera (No mobile phones or other electronic devices)
- A refillable drinks bottle
- A rucksack for use in the day – with sturdy straps
- Stamped addressed post card
- Talent show clothes/equipment if needed
- Teddy

The children will be away for 5 days, so please pack accordingly, bearing in mind that they will need to carry their own luggage. Please label everything.

Medical & Personal



Parents will need to complete parental consent and paracetamol forms (1 month before).

Mrs Arnaud will be available on the afternoon of Friday 15th May for parents to hand over any medication for the trip (including travel sickness). All medicines must be signed over to a member of staff. Please can you ensure the medicines are clearly labelled with your child's name. If you have any other queries please call in to see us at this time.

We can also take these on Monday morning if necessary.

If there are night time issues that we should be aware of such as, night terrors or bed wetting, please see Mrs Smith as soon as possible.

We will take spare sanitary products with us.

Spending Money



Some of our locations have gift shops.
Maximum £40 split over 4 days.

Two named envelopes each containing up to £10 (for Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday) to be handed in to Mrs Arnaud after school on Friday 15th May or on Monday morning please.

Monday's money (up to £10) in named purse/wallet, in child's back pack ready for RAF Cosford.

Behaviour



We have the same high expectations as we do in school.

We're often complimented on the outstanding behaviour of our children.

Children will contribute to a code of conduct for the trip before the visit.

Whilst very unlikely, if a situation arises where a child's behaviour puts their own safety or the safety of other children or staff at risk, or there is a serious breach of behaviour expectations, we will contact you to travel to Wales to collect your child.

Cost and Payment



We hope that cost per child will be similar to last year – around £400.

Payment can either be made in full or with an initial deposit of £75 (October 6th) followed by five further instalments.
