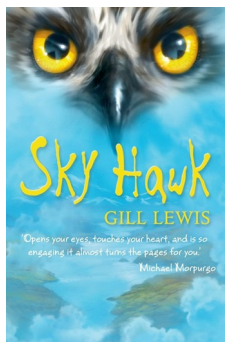

English



To start this half term, pupils will be reading and basing their writing on 'Sky Hawk' by Gill Lewis. During this module of work pupils will be sentence stacking and working towards writing a newspaper report.

Throughout this text, pupils will focus on key comprehension skills such as: making reasonable predictions; using their skimming

and scanning skills to identify information in the text and finding appropriate evidence in order to justify their point of view.

Each week pupils will continue to have discrete whole class reading sessions based on a variety of different genre of texts or extracts.

General Introduction:

Welcome back to Waddesdon Village Primary School for Spring 1. We hope that you enjoyed your Christmas break . This term we have planned many interesting learning opportunities for your children to ensure that they are engaged and make good progress throughout the curriculum.

Mathematics

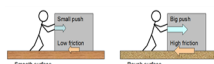
This half term children will be building on their previous learning from year 4, as well as learning a range of new mathematical skills. These include: adding and subtracting decimals; investigating factors, multiples and prime numbers; squaring and cubing numbers and applying these concepts to find the area and volume of shapes.

Throughout these conceptual areas, pupils will have the opportunity to practice their problem solving and reasoning skills, in familiar and unfamiliar contexts.



Science– Forces

Class 5 will be turning into investigatory Scientists this half term as our Science lessons will be very experimental and hands-on. We will be undergoing practical investigations on forces such as gravity, friction, air resistance and water resistance. Pupils will be independently conducting these investigations, involving recording results, analysing findings, writing summaries and presenting data in varying statistical graphs.

PE

Invasion Games– In their PE lessons, led by an Exposure Sports Instructor, the children will be building on and developing skills required to play invasion games.

Dance– Pupils will be studying a wide variety of different types of dance, including Scottish Ceilidh dancing which links to our core text.



RE

During RE this term, pupils will be looking at the beliefs and morals of Sikhism. Throughout this unit of work pupils will study a variety of different religious scriptures and make links between what they have studied and their own beliefs.





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Geography
 To link with our core text, pupils will be studying a variety of different countries and continents that an osprey visits during its migration to Africa. This will include Britain, countries in Europe and Africa. During this unit of work pupils will learn how to read a variety of maps; identify and compare key human, physical and topographical features and consider the impact that human activity has had within location.

DT
 During Design Technology this half term, pupils will be designing, making prototypes and testing their own gliders. Pupils will then make a final product that will be flown in a competitive class competition.

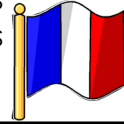


Music
 This half term, children will be studying African music which links to our core text and dance in PE. During this unit, pupils will listen and appraise a variety of songs; use percussion instruments and drums for improvisation and start to compose their own African inspired music.



Computing
 In computing this half term, pupils will be looking at spreadsheets. During this unit, children will learn how to use formula; the counting tool and how to perform calculations.

MFL– La Nourriture
 This half term, pupils will continue to study the Rigalo scheme of work and be taught by a specialist French teacher. Pupils will be learning how to order food items in a restaurant; express opinions about different foods and be able to explain if food is healthy or unhealthy.

How you can support your child at home:
 Children will be receiving home learning every Thursday which is due in the following Tuesday. Home learning will be linked to what pupils will be learning in Maths and English. As a school we are continuing to have a big push on children reading for pleasure. Part of our home learning expectations is that your children read every night at home for 20 minutes (at least one of these should be on Bug Club). We are also still running our Reading Rocket challenge and children can bring these books home or choose to read them in class. A full list of Reading Rocket texts are available on our website. Pupils knowledge of times tables and number bonds are vital for pupils to be able to be successful in mathematics. Please could you ensure that your children are practicing these through Times Table Rock Stars and Numbots at least 3 times a week. This again is now a home learning expectation. In KS2 we will be continuing to follow the Spelling Book scheme for learning Spellings.
