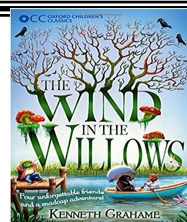
**English:**

Our core text this half term is "The Wind in the Willows" by Kenneth Grahame. We have chosen this text because it links well to our science topic of habitats. We will read the book together in whole class guided reading and discuss the rich vocabulary. It will be useful to investigate language used and written in this classic novel from 1908. The Wildlife Trust has some video clips that we will be using to link to our science, particularly focussing on how humans impact the environment. We will build upon our previous grammar and punctuation knowledge to write a non-chronological report about one of the animals from the story. Our regular reading comprehensions will use sections of the book and use non-fiction texts about animals and habitats.

**General Introduction:**

Welcome back to the final half term in Class 4. This will be a busy time as we have a longer term enabling us to finish some areas from Summer 1 and lots of new activities to pack in. With a school trip, the KS2 production and KS2 Bastille Day to look forward to it should be a great end to a great year!

**Mathematics:**

As previously mentioned the expectation is that children know all their tables up to 12 X 12 by the end of Year 4. The Multiplication Check will commence w/b 13th June. Please ensure your children are in school for this week, if they are unable to attend we are able to continue the check until the end of w/b 20th June. We have been practising our times tables all year round in school and it would be greatly appreciated if you could continue this at home in preparation, TTRS and hit the Button are great for this. This half term the children will continue with decimals and then finish with the final units for Year 4, including: statistics and data handling; shape and angles; position and direction. Mrs Morris will continue to cover: basic skills 1 lesson per fortnight and investigation work 1 lesson per fortnight. In the basic skills lessons Mrs Morris will maintain their use of the 4 operations.

**Science:**

Firstly, will be finishing off our 'changing state' topic and then we will move onto this half term's topic which is All Living Things. There will be a focus on Habitats. The children will be identifying, sorting and classifying plants and animals with the use of keys. We will get the opportunity to visit the new school pond as part of our topic. Then they will investigate habitats of plants and animals. Finally, the class will investigate how humans have an impact on the environment and explore ways we can help or change things in our local natural environment.

**Weekly schedules:**

PE lessons will continue on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.  
Mrs Morris will continue to teach the class on Wednesday mornings and PPA will be covered on Wednesday afternoons by a specialist PE teacher and our Class TAs.

**PE:**

PE with Mr McGeeney/Exposure Sport on Wednesday afternoon and with myself on a Tuesday morning.

**RE:**

This half term the children will return to the religion of Christianity. This unit they will focus on prayer and worship. The children will discuss and investigate the question - Do people need to go to church?"

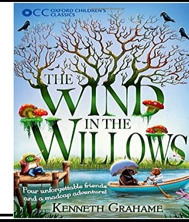
#### **Geography:**

This half term we will continue to find out about invaders and settlers of the UK. So far we have looked at timelines and investigated the decline of the Roman Empire. We then investigated why and how the Anglo-Saxons came to Britain and how they were converted to Christianity. During Summer 2 we will now research the Viking invaders. We will use maps to identify where the Vikings came from; research aspects of life and find out about the Viking long-ships

#### **MFL:**

French will continue to be taught by Mr Mitchener on Thursday mornings. He will be following the Rigolo scheme of French work, which continues in Summer 2 with a unit called "Le Cirque".

This half term our art topic is tapestry. We will look at Anglo-Saxon and Viking art and writing, and also the Bayeux tapestry to inspire our own designs.

#### **PSHE:**

We will finish our relationships unit from Summer term 1. This will be followed with the final unit named "Changing Me". This unit includes the year 4 Sex Relationship Education content. A letter will be sent out explaining the unit before we commence the teaching.

#### **Music:**

We will start the half term by rehearsing and performing the songs for the KS2 performance. We will then move onto the theme Rivers with our new music scheme 'Kapow'. I have chosen this because of the setting of Wind and The Willows.
