

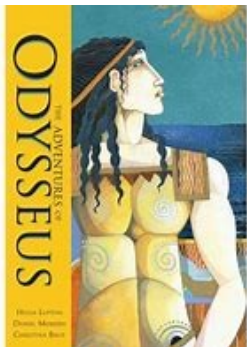

History

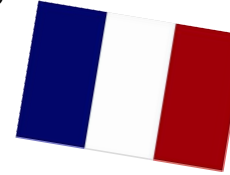
Ancient Greece
