

Summer Term 2 2023

Class 6 Home Learning

There are 3 areas of homework to complete each week:

1. **Reading:** You should read for 20 minutes on at least 4 days each week. The expectation is that you will record these 4 days, when you have read at home, in your Reading Record and hand this in each Monday. Your Reading Record will be returned back to you on the same day. When you read, think about what you have read, collect examples of rich vocabulary and discuss your book with an adult regularly. Vary the authors, genres and text types you select and strive to read from the Reading Rocket selection often.
2. **Maths:** You should log on to **Times Tables Rock Stars and Numbots** at home at least 3 times each week to practise your tables and arithmetic skills.
3. You need to choose either an **English or a maths activity** to complete in your homework book and hand this in on Tuesday. Try to choose from each section over the term. Books will be returned to you each Friday.

There is a chart in your Reading Record to tick off each part of your homework daily so that you don't forget anything. Trying your very best, being organised with homework and meeting these expectations will result in house points, stickers or certificates and, of course, you will be learning, practising key skills and becoming an independent learner. If any of the 3 homework expectations are not fully complete, the consequence will be to complete the missing work during a break time. If there is more than 1 expectation missing, you will need to stay in during another break time.

English Activities:

- Write a newspaper report about the Ancient Greek Olympic games.
- Create a story board or cartoon strip to show a Greek myth.
- Prepare a biography about William Shakespeare. This can be written in your book or presented on PowerPoint or the Keynote app. Either email your work to the office or save it to your Showbie account.
- Write a paragraph to describe a character from A Midsummer Night's Dream.
- Write a recommendation for one of our reading rockets; think about how you can make it sound appealing to other readers.

Maths Activities:

- Foreign currency
 - a. Find out the current exchange rate for the Pakistani Rupee.
 - b. How much (in pounds sterling) would it cost to buy 5000 Pakistani Rupees.
 - c. A shawl is priced at 7600 Rupees in Pakistan. What is the equivalent price in pounds sterling?
 - d. What denominations are Pakistani Rupee banknotes available in?
 - e. Write your own question that involves using an exchange rate.
- Budgets
Plan a party for 12 people. You need to buy food, drinks, decorations and prizes.
 - a. Research the real cost of items you would like to have at the party.
 - b. You have a budget of £200 for the whole event. List what you will buy and the cost.
 - c. What was difficult about this and what did you do to help?
 - d. Could you have a party for 12 people that's cheaper? How?

Create a poster, Pic Collage, PowerPoint or Keynote which details the properties of a range of 2D and 3D shapes.
